GREEN DIAMOND RESOURCE COMPANY RELEASES ITS FOURTH-ANNUAL SUSTAINABILITY REPORT

The 2025 report highlights the establishment and progress towards a new set of 2030 sustainability goals.

Seattle, Wash. (July 8, 2026) – Green Diamond Resource Company, the Seattle-based forest landowner and manager with roots back to 1890, today released its fourth-annual Sustainability Report highlighting significant progress across forest conservation, carbon removal projects, and other innovative opportunities across the industry.

The 2025 report introduces a set of forward-looking, 2030 sustainability goals. The updated targets are intended to increase accountability and continue to help the organization measure impact. New 2030 goals include:

- Fully integrating the new Enterprise Risk Management plan with comprehensive land management strategies to enhance operational alignment and sustainability.
- Establishing a best-in-class safety culture driven by proactive employee engagement, ensuring the protection of all employees and contractors, and embedding safety considerations into every company decision.
- Deploying and operationalizing three cutting-edge innovative technologies to advance business performance and industry leadership.

“Sustainability is a field that is evolving quickly, and Green Diamond is committed to evolving with it,” said Douglas Reed, Chair and President of Green Diamond Resource Company. “By remaining committed to sustainable forestry practices, we are positioning our business for a bright future.”

The 2025 annual explores how Green Diamond is advancing sustainability initiatives across 2.2 million acres of diverse working forests. Green Diamond continues to provide essential ecosystem services through an approach that sustains biodiversity, protects water supply, and advances climate benefits. Green Diamond also takes a locally informed view of harvesting, reforestation and conservation practices across the national footprint to reflect the unique needs of each forest.

Green Diamond’s 2025 Sustainability Report highlights include:

- Adding nearly 53,000 acres to phase two of the Montana Great Outdoors project, which protects large, connected landscapes across Northwest Montana.
- In partnership with Ducks Unlimited, advancing an early-stage voluntary biodiversity credit pilot in Oregon’s upper Klamath Basin.
- Reforesting 22,900 acres; replanted ~8.4M seedlings.
- Hosting international members of the Sustainable Biomass Program (SBP) Standards Committee in the United States for the first time to share insight into sustainable forest management practices at scale.

- Transferring 47,000 acres of land along the Klamath River from Green Diamond to the Yurok Tribe.
- Reducing lost time injuries from two to zero year-over-year and improved recordable injury rate from 4.4 to 2.0 in 2025, representing our best company-wide incident rate in over a decade.

“No one organization can tackle the challenges of sustainable forestry alone,” Reed said. “Real progress requires us to learn and work together. From collaborating with fellow forestry advocates to investing in local communities and supporting our employees’ passions for sustainability, Green Diamond is focused on durable pathways for industry growth.”
