Project Overview

The Thompson River IFM Project was developed under the California Air Resources Board (CARB) Compliance Offset Protocol – U.S. Forest Projects (Version: June 2015). The project commenced on February 10, 2021, following the acquisition of the property by Green Diamond Resource Company.

Located west of Glacier National Park in northwestern Montana, the project area encompasses lands along the Thompson River, within the Thompson-Fisher Conservation Easement, established in 2003 by Plum Creek Timberlands in partnership with the Montana Department of Fish, Wildlife and Parks. The Thompson River IFM Project also borders another Green Diamond carbon project, Lost Trail IFM.

Historical harvest practices prior to Green Diamond's acquisition left a lasting legacy of reduced forest stocking and altered stand structure, underscoring the need for restoration and improved management.

Co-Benefits

Through the implementation of improved forest management practices, Green Diamond Resource Company is restoring forest health and productivity while increasing carbon storage, enhancing fire resiliency, and protecting wildlife habitat, contributing to the long-term sustainability of Montana's forest ecosystems.
