If you have an antlerless tag, please collect teeth, the reproductive tract, udder, and kidneys with attached fat. The samples you collect will be used to monitor the herd's pregnancy rate. Stop by the field headquarters, or ask a biologist for collection bags and instructions for gathering these samples. We'll even do it for you.
